RMRCA Student Volunteer Scholarships

RMRCA believes that volunteer involvement is an integral part of a strong and prosperous community. To encourage this value, the RMRCA rewards students who demonstrate outstanding volunteer involvement in their school, their community and city.

Two scholarships are available in the amount of \$1,000 each! Students living in the Rosemont Mount Royal community can submit their resumés in writing by May 15th, 2023 for a chance to be awarded one of the two scholarships in June.

To apply, simply submit your cover letter and resumé which includes your name, mailing address, email address and the name of the Institution that you will be attending for the 2023/2024 year. Resumé must outline your volunteer history as well as any current community involvement that you participate in. Resumé must also include the name and contact information of at least one (1) reference that can verify your volunteer involvement.

Scholarships are intended to assist students with post-secondary education costs. Payment of scholarship will be remitted upon proof of acceptance to a post-secondary institution.

School Zone Safety

Did you know that the Rosemont Mount Royal area is home to three elementary schools and one high school, not to mention several public and private daycare facilities? Currently, there are over 1,000 students enrolled in these facilities with 880 students enrolled in the 3 elementary schools alone – Walker School, Rosemont School, and St. Francis School. Some of these students arrive by bus, some by parent drop off, and some walk. Twice daily, many dozens of buses, personal vehicles, kids, and crosswalk monitors are orchestrating drop off/pick up of excited kids in a one or two block area that, let's face it, was not originally designed for such use. School zones have changed a lot – today nearly 3/4 of the kids are driven to school. This has led to a significant increase in vehicle traffic in school zones, bringing with it more unsafe driving.

Normally this all goes off without a hitch and safely. Recent reports of mounting traffic concerns in the designated school zones has been brought to RMRCA's attention. Reports suggest that drivers are exceeding the speed limit and failing to slow down even when crosswalk monitors and/or children are present. Children, as well as the monitors and teachers who are responsible for their safety, are at serious risk of injury. It has been reported that on an almost daily basis, vehicles are making illegal U-turns in the middle of the school crosswalks and parking in no parking zones that are clearly marked with signage or school traffic cones. This in turn impedes safety for teachers, nearby residents, students, and their families. Sadly, this activity is not limited to those passing through the community on their daily commute.

Despite the efforts of the schools, the speed concerns are not getting better. So what is the solution? Traffic laws and speed need to be enforced. The RMRCA is supporting the work of the elementary schools to find solutions and have reached out to the City of Regina and Regina Police Services to help enforce and control the speeding traffic and blatant disregard for safety within the school zones. Information and data is being collected on unsafe driving practices in school zones. In doing so, stakeholders will be able to find solutions for our school zones.

Please folks, drive safely and obey traffic rules so that we can continue to have a safe community for our students and residents – nothing is more important than the safety of our children.
